UPDATE: Police Seek Public's Help in Fatal Motorcycle Crash Investigation



The Athens Police Department is continuing its investigation into a fatal motorcycle crash that occurred on the morning of Wednesday, June 18.



Investigators are reviewing surveillance footage from nearby businesses and say the vehicle involved appears to be a dark-colored SUV driven by a white female. The exact make and model of the SUV have not yet been identified.

Good Faith Clinic Marks 30 Years of Service with Celebration Event



The Good Faith Clinic will celebrate its 30th anniversary **TODAY**, **Monday**, **June 23**, with a community event from **4 to 6 p.m. at Christ Community Church**, **14 Congress Parkway South in Athens**. The event will honor the clinic's volunteer providers and supporters, and will include guest speakers, refreshments, and tours. The event is open to the public and everyone is encouraged to attend.

Founded in 1995, the Good Faith Clinic has provided free primary healthcare to uninsured adults ages 18 to 64 across McMinn and Meigs counties. What began as a vision years earlier by Dr. David Byrd—who was inspired by his experiences as an EMT and emergency room physician—has grown into a vital community service. With guidance from local leaders and support from area organizations, the clinic officially opened its doors at the McMinn County Health Department, offering doctor visits, lab work, x-rays, and pharmaceutical assistance. The clinic later relocated to Tennessee Wesleyan College and eventually to Christ Community Church, where it operates today. In 2008, it moved into a custom facility at 18 South Congress Parkway thanks to support from United Way. Over the years, it has been sustained by volunteers, local churches, industries, and private donors.

Now operating on the 2nd, 4th, and 5th Thursdays of each month, the Good Faith Clinic continues to provide free primary health care for residents of McMinn and Meigs counties, ages of 18-64, who do not have any form of medical insurance, including TennCare. Its long-standing mission remains unchanged: to provide compassionate, free healthcare to those in need.

Fire Destroys Goodfellows Building, **Donations Needed**



A fire late Monday 25,000-square-foot building at the former

Bowater Plant—now the Domtar Corporation—in Calhoun, Tennessee. The blaze broke out around 10:45 p.m., consuming the structure that once housed the Bowater Credit Union and was most recently used by the Bowater Goodfellows charitable organization.

Founded in 1955 by Bowater employees, Bowater Goodfellows is a nonprofit that provides coats, toys, and food baskets to families during the holiday season. The fire resulted in a total loss of the group's stored donations and supplies.

In response, Bowater Credit Union will continue its annual "Christmas in July" campaign to help rebuild the organization's resources. Beginning July 1, all Bowater Credit Union branches will collect toys, coats, and monetary donations for the Goodfellows.
