Two Flee Crash Scene in McMinn County; THP Investigating



Two men fled on foot after a single-vehicle crash late Wednesday morning in McMinn County.

The crash occurred around 11:30 a.m. on June 25 when a 2009 Dodge Challenger traveling south on County Road 316 near County Road 276 appeared to lose control, cross the center line, and overturn. The vehicle came to rest on its roof.


Witnesses reported seeing two male subjects running from the scene toward the Pilot station at Exit 56.

During the investigation, authorities discovered a handgun, drug paraphernalia, and several forms of identifi-

cation inside the vehicle.

Responding agencies included the Niota Rural Fire Department, North McMinn Rural Fire Department, McMinn County Sheriff's Office, AMR, and the Tennessee Highway Patrol. THP is leading the investigation.

Landyn is known for staying active both in and out of school. He plays on McMinn Central's football and basketball teams, works as a lifeguard at the Englewood Pool, and teaches a youth class at his church. Now, he's taken on a new role—promoting early childhood literacy in McMinn County.

As part of the League, Landyn is working to register local children for the Imagination Library, a program that delivers a free book each month to children from birth to age five. He's also raising funds to cover the cost of one year of books per child, supported locally by the McMinn County Education Foundation. Quilts of Valor Presented to Local Veterans at Optimist Club Meeting



At this week's meeting of the Optimist Club of Athens, veterans Charlie Senn and Bill Sikes were honored with Quilts of Valor in recognition of their military service.

The quilts were presented by Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Cassem as part of the national *Quilts of Valor* program, which has awarded over 400,000 quilts to veterans across the country since it began in 2003.

Senn served in the U.S. Marine Corps, while Sikes served in both the Navy Reserves and the U.S. Army. The ceremony served as a heartfelt tribute to their dedication and sacrifice.

AUB Customers Can Resume Normal Power Use as TVA Stabilizes Grid

The Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) has stabilized its power supply, allowing Athens Utilities Board (AUB) electric customers to return to normal electricity usage.

The recent call for reduced power came in response to extreme temperatures that placed significant strain on the TVA power system. Thanks to the cooperation of more than 10 million consumers across the region, further disruptions were avoided.

Throughout the shortage, TVA and AUB implemented energy-saving measures such as adjusting thermostats, reducing lighting, and encouraging voluntary conservation during peak hours. TVA also maximized output from all available plants, purchased additional power from neighboring utilities, and temporarily curtailed service to large industrial customers on interruptible contracts.

Crews from both TVA and AUB worked around the clock to maintain service and restore full capacity. AUB extends its thanks to the community for its patience and cooperation during the high-demand period.
