

McMinn Gas Prices Below State and National Averages Ahead of July 4th



With Independence Day fast approaching and over 61 million Americans expected to travel, gas prices are creeping upward—but Tennessee drivers are still enjoying some of the lowest prices in the country.

As of June 29, the average price for a gallon of regular gasoline in **McMinn County is** \$2.749, according to AAA data. This sits below both the **Tennessee state average of** \$2.788 and the **national average of** \$3.22. Compared to one year ago, when the national average was \$3.49, fuel is significantly cheaper across much of the country. Tennessee ranks among the top 10 least expensive states for gas, tied with Texas and Louisiana at \$2.82 per gallon, a reflection of favorable supply and distribution conditions in the region.

Still, AAA warns that with the holiday travel rush, prices may inch upward. The current national average of \$3.22 Morning Fax is up two cents from last week and four cents from a month ago.


In McMinn County, gas prices are consistent with nearby counties in East Tennessee, many of which fall into the \$2.74–\$2.78 range. The region remains more affordable than much of the western and northeastern U.S., where prices often exceed \$3.50.

Interestingly, while Tennessee enjoys some of the cheapest gas, it also ranks third-highest nationally for public EV charging costs, averaging 47 cents per kilowatt-hour, according to AAA.



Travelers are encouraged to plan ahead, fill up early in the week, and use fuel-saving driving techniques to minimize costs as they hit the road for the holiday.

City of Athens Fireworks Reminder



As we approach the July 4th holiday, the City of Athens reminds residents of the rules regarding fireworks within the city limits:

Please note that the following regulations are in reference only to documentation found in the bylaws set forth by the City of Athens, Tennessee as listed on the website of the City of Athens Fire Department found on the following webpage **HERE**. Regulations may vary by location, so residents are encouraged to contact their local city hall or fire department to confirm what is allowed in their area.

- Fireworks are broadly prohibited. This includes items like firecrackers, Roman candles, bottle rockets, sparklers, and any device that explodes or creates a visible or audible effect through combustion.
- The manufacture, sale, and use of fireworks are not allowed within the city, unless a special permit is granted.
- Public displays may be allowed with a permit issued by the Fire Department. These displays must be handled by approved professionals and be deemed safe by both the Police and Fire Chiefs.
- Permit applications must be submitted in writing at least 15 days in advance of any planned display. Permits are for public events only and are not transferable.
