Road 750 in Riceville left one driver injured. The crash occurred around 4:30 p.m. and involved a 2013 Kia Optima and a 2013 Mercedes. The driver of the Kia sustained injuries but declined transport to the hospital.

# TWRA Cracks Down on Boating Under the Influence During July 4th Weekend

The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA) will join the nationwide Operation Dry Water campaign from July 4–6, focusing on the prevention and enforcement of boating under the influence (BUI) during one of the busiest boating weekends of the year.

TWRA officers will be out in full force across Tennessee waterways, watching for impaired boat operators and increasing public awareness about the dangers of alcohol and drug use on the water. Boaters can expect increased patrols throughout the weekend.

Morning Fax Alcohol is the leading contributing factor in recreational boating deaths. Sun, wind, and motion on the water can intensify the effects of alcohol and drugs, putting both operators amateur and passengers at risk.

Operating a boat with a blood alcohol content of .08% or higher is illegal in Tennessee and carries penalties such as fines, jail time, boat impoundment, and loss of boating privileges.

Operation Dry Water, started in 2009 by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA), is supported by TWRA, the U.S. Coast Guard, and Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) to promote safer boating statewide.
