Athens City Council to Meet August 19

The Athens City Council will hold its regular session on Tuesday, August 19, at 6 p.m. in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers at City Hall.

The meeting will include the presentation of the VIVID Award honoring the late Randy Sliger, consideration of several bids and resolutions, and discussion of projects ranging from Heritage Park renovations to downtown parking improvements.

Items on the consent agenda include street resurfacing, fire hose equipment surplus, participation in safety and property conservation grant programs, and approval of the process for a new retail package store application. Council will also hold a public hearing and second reading of Ordinance 1143, concerning penalties and court costs in Athens Municipal Court.

New business items include the design and construction of Fire Station #3, installation of poles and banners at Veterans Park, possible property transactions, sidewalk project results, charter amendments, and a request for funds from the Commemorative Air Force. Monthly reports from the finance, fire, and police departments are also scheduled, along with an update from City Manager Randall Dowling.

Longtime motorsports broadcaster, announcer, and publicist, Etowah's own, Roby Helm has been inducted into the National Dirt Late Model Hall of Fame Class of 2025. The Hall of Fame is located at Florence Speedway in Walton, Kentucky.

Helm has spent more than 45

years in the industry, working with many of the nation's top short track racing sanctioning bodies. For three decades, he provided play-by-play and color commentary on national television, appearing on Prime Network, Speedvision, the SPEED Channel, and Hunt The Front TV. He continues to stay active in the sport as the lead announcer at Dixie Speedway in Woodstock, Georgia, and as a play-by-play voice for the Hunt The Front Super Dirt Series on huntthefront.tv.

Helm's induction honors a career marked by dedication to dirt late model racing and his influential role in growing the sport's visibility across the country.

Etowah Senior Center to Host Monthly Mobile Medical Clinic



The Etowah Senior Center will begin offering a new medical service for McMinn County residents through a partnership with the University of Ten-

nessee Chattanooga School of Nursing. Starting this Wednesday, and continuing on the third Wednesday of each month, the Mobile Medical Unit—known as the "Mobile Moc"—will be on site from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The clinic will prioritize adults age 62 and older, but will also see patients 18 and up as time allows. Services include primary care, wellness exams, cancer screenings, acute care, vision and hearing screenings, referrals to specialists, strength and balance assessments, mental health and memory screenings, caregiver support, end-of-life planning, nutrition, chronic disease management, medication assistance, and telehealth. 
