Charges Pending After Authorities Uncover Large-Scale Counterfeit Luxury Goods Operation




Charges are pending following an investigation by the Monroe County Sheriff's Office that uncovered a large-scale operation allegedly selling counterfeit luxury merchandise.

According to the sheriff's office, investigators were contacted in late October or early November by a private company that specializes in identifying fraudulent sales of counterfeit goods on behalf of luxury brands such as Louis Vuitton, Prada, and Coach. The company had been tracking an online retailer known as The Luxe Closet since November 2023 for allegedly selling fake luxury-branded items.

Investigators said the operation initially distributed products from Hamilton County before shifting its distribution center to Madisonville sometime in 2025, prompting the company to alert local authorities.

Monroe County investigators confirmed the alleged fraud by making multiple online purchases and retrieving the items from the Madisonville location. With assistance from the Madisonville Police Department and the Tenth Ju-

dicial District Attorney's Office, authorities executed search warrants at both the Madisonville distribution center and the owner's residence in Hamilton County.

Rear-End Crash Reported Near School Bus Stop in Niota




A rear-end collision occurred Friday just before 4 p.m. on Willson Street near Starr Street in the City of Niota after a vehicle slowed for a school bus.

Bowater Credit Union Donates \$1,000 to Grace and Mercy Ministries

their mission is providing transportation for people to come to the center for a hot meal and a shower. The center also has a pantry that supplies snack packs to people who might need extra help over weekends and holidays.

With Bowater's Pay It Forward grant, Grace and Mercy Ministries will be able to provide three meals to over 100 people—enough to help feed their community for a week. The funds will also be used to stock the pantry, buy utensils, and fuel the bus for transportation needs. This support could also boost volunteer morale and strengthen volunteer engagement. Grace and Mercy Ministries relies heavily on local churches and three annual fundraisers. With this award, we hope to bring awareness to such a wholesome organization. All Injuries Minor Following Crash Involving McMinn County Deputy



All individuals involved in a vehicle crash involving a McMinn County Sheriff's deputy Saturday afternoon were transported to a local hospital as a precaution, ac-

cording to an updated statement from Sheriff Joe Guy. The sheriff reported that all injuries were minor.

The crash occurred around 12:30 p.m. on Ingleside Avenue in Athens while a deputy was transporting an arrestee. Initial information released by the sheriff indicated the deputy's patrol vehicle collided with another car after it reportedly pulled out in front of the patrol unit.

Sheriff Guy said an investigation into the crash is ongoing. No additional details about the cause of the collision were provided in the latest update.

Further information is expected to be released as the investigation continues.

Counterfeit Goods (Continued)

During the search, investigators seized more than 3,000 counterfeit items, including handbags, wallets, clothing, jewelry, watches, and shoes. If authentic, officials estimated the items would have had a retail value of approximately \$1.2 million. Authorities also recovered counterfeit leather spray used to enhance the appearance and smell of the fake products, along with a portable building used for storage and a vehicle allegedly used to transport the merchandise.

Investigators reported finding evidence suggesting the counterfeit goods originated outside the United States. The Monroe County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division continues to investigate the source of the products.

Officials emphasized that while it is not illegal to possess counterfeit items for personal use, it is illegal to sell or possess such items with the intent to sell. The investigation remains ongoing, and charges are pending.
