Local Troops Participate in National Wreaths Across America Program Saturday



American Heritage Girls Troop 1824 and Boys Trail Life USA Troop 1212 recently joined volunteers nationwide by laying wreaths at memorials in Athens Veterans Park as part of the annual Wreaths Across America effort honoring fallen service members.

The initiative began in the 1990s when Maine businessman Morrill Worcester, owner of Worcester Wreath Company, donated surplus holiday wreaths to Arlington National Cemetery. That gesture eventually evolved into a national nonprofit with a stated mission of honoring veterans, supporting military families, and educating the public. The organization grew into a charity generating more than \$30 million annually. Local participation in Athens highlights the program's grassroots support.

American Heritage Girls was founded by a group of parents wanting a faith-based, scouttype character development program for their daughters in 1995. The AHG Program is dedicated to the mission of building women of integrity through service to God, family, community and country. AHG girls across the nation and the globe participate in badge

programs, service projects, leadership opportunities, and outdoor experiences, all with an emphasis on Christian values and family involvement.

Boys Trail Life USA partners with churches and parents across America as the premier national character development organization for young men, which produces generations of godly and responsible husbands, fathers, and citizens. Fathers and sons are connecting, relationships are deepening, communities are being impacted, and legacies are being established as a new generation of godly leaders rises up. McMinn County Unemployment Holds at 4.5% in September

McMinn County's unemployment rate held steady at 4.5% in September, according to the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development. The rate was unchanged from August and slightly higher than the 4.2% reported in September 2024.

The county reported a labor force of 25,370, with 24,228 employed and 1,142 unemployed. McMinn County's rate remains above the statewide unemployment rate of 3.6%, which was unchanged for the month and lower than the national rate of 4.4%.

Across Tennessee, nonfarm employment increased by 3,400 jobs between August and September, with gains led by accommodation and food services, manufacturing, and government. Over the past year, employers statewide added 35,800 jobs.

Nearly all Tennessee counties reported unemployment rates below 5% in September, including neighboring Meigs County at 4.9%. County unemployment figures are not seasonally adjusted.

Vehicle Overturns on Highway 307 in Athens




A single-vehicle crash was reported Saturday night around 8 p.m. on Highway 307 in Athens when the driver of a 2014 Mazda CX-5 Touring ran off the roadway, lost control, and overturned.

Police Investigate Domestic Disturbance, **Shooting on Lynn Avenue**

Athens Police responded to a domestic disturbance at 322 Lynn Avenue on Dec. 13, where Skyler Farrar of Athens was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct, resisting arrest, and retaliation for past actions.

Several hours later, officers were called back to the same address after reports of shots fired. Police said an individual driving a white Chrysler PT Cruiser fired multiple rounds toward the residence, striking an outbuilding. No injuries were reported.

Athens Police detectives, assisted by the McMinn County Sheriff's Office, identified a suspect in the shooting. Robert Gaston was taken into custody, and a weapon believed to be used in the incident was recovered from his McMinn County residence. Gaston was charged with tampering with evidence and resisting arrest, with additional charges pending. Police said the Tennessee Highway Patrol has also filed unrelated charges against Gaston. The investigation remains ongoing.
